- Vide the above show cause notice issued to your college, it was directed to furnish the reply regarding each of the points raised in the show cause notice within three days (3 days) and give an explanation as to why the seats allocated to your institution for MBBS not be reduced in A-Y 2024-25, or should a monetary penalty as per the regulations not be imposed since your college has not fulfilled the provisions laid down under NMC Act 2019 and other various guidelines, regulation notified by NMC. Here, it is pertinent to reiterate that all the medical colleges were earlier continuously intimated in the form of circulars/public notices uploaded through NMC website and show cause notices stating to take necessary action to fulfill the provisions laid in various regulations and guidelines by NMC. Further, vide above show cause notice issued, your medical colleges were given an additional opportunity to submit the point-wise explanation on the observations, if any, through the virtual hearing before the Undergraduate Medical Education Board.
- 3. In the above virtual hearing, your college was represented by the Dean/Principal/Vice-Principal/HoD, who appeared before the Board on 10.05.2024: However, the clarifications furnished by your institution were not found convincing and satisfactory. The college also accepted the deficiencies and assured to fulfill the same within a very short span of time.
- 4. Since the portal for submission of Annual Declaration Form has been introduced first time, taking a lenient view the Board decided to grant renewal of 150 seats for undergraduate (MBBS) for the year 2024-25 subject to deposit of a fine of Rs.6,00,000/- (Rupees Six lacs only) as a first measure; subsequently, after a gap of two months, the re-assessment of your college will be carried out. If deficiencies exist with your college, stringent action as mandated under MSMER-2023 Chapter-III clause-8 under the heading penalties shall be imposed.

- 5. As per, it is directed to remit the penalty amount within seven days (7 days) into "NMC Own Resources, Canara Bank Account No. 90682160000025, IFSC code CNRB0019109" and forward confirmation of payment along with transaction details to ug.scn@nmc.org.in.
- 6. If you are not satisfied and aggrieved with the decision of the Board, you are free to prefer an appeal before the Commission under Section 9, Chapter IV of the Maintenance of Standards of Medical Education Regulations, 2023, (MSMER, 2023) within sixty days of the issue of this letter.

WHEREAS, the Post-Graduate Medical Education Board (PGMEB) got the assessment of the Department of (General Medicine) of the Vinayaka Mission's Medical College & Hospital, Karaikal affiliated to Vinayaka Mission's Research Foundation (Deemed to be University), Salem, Tamil Nadu done on 09th January, 2023 for verification of infrastructure, clinical material, faculty for all-round training of students as per curriculum requirement. On scrutiny of the Assessment Report and other records, the Post-Graduate Medical Education Board (PGMEB) found the following deficiencies:

- Inadequate number of beds in PG department; not conforming to MSR-2020;
- ii. Inadequate clinical material/work load for learning and clinical skills of the PG students:
- iii. There were only four units. Fifth unit was required as per MSR-2020.
- 2. WHEREAS, the deficiencies stated in **para 1 above** were pointed out to the said medical college *vide* PGMEB Letter No.35/737(22)/2022-PGMEB/009652 dated 3rd March, 2023 and the medical college was given an opportunity to submit a written explanation in respect of the deficiencies. The said medical college furnished the reply vide letter No.VMMC&H, Karaikal/NMC/PG/Compliance/2023/1097 dated 3rd April, 2023. The Compliance Verification Report, furnished by the said medical college, was placed before the Post-Graduate Medical Education Board. The reply furnished by the medical college was not found satisfactory and acceptable by the Board as the medical college has not given proper justification for the inadequate number of beds, clinical material and beds.
- 3. WHEREAS, the responsibility of determination and maintenance of standards of post-graduate medical education is entrusted upon the Post-Graduate Medical Education Board of the National Medical Commission as per National Medical Commission Act, 2019 (NMC Act, 2019), Post-Graduate Medical Education Regulations-2000 (PGMER-2000) and Maintenance of Standards of Medical Education Regulations, 2023 (MSMER-2023). Further, **Section 6.2** of the PGMER-2000 and Section 8(1) and (2) of the MSMER-2023, stipulate imposition of penalty(ies) on the medical college/institution, if they fail to comply with any statutory provisions.
- 4. WHEREAS the medical college has failed to comply with the requirements and has compromised with the quality of medical education. Considering the inadequate clinical material, inadequate beds and units in the Department of General Medicine, which is adequate for seven post-graduate seats, the Post-

Graduate Medical Education Board has decided to recognise seven seats of MD (General Medicine) and to reduce the annual intake capacity in the course of MD (General Medicine) from the existing eight to seven from the Academic Year 2024-2025. Hence, the break-up of MD (General Medicine) seats in the medical college will be as indicated below:

Vinayaka Mission's Research Foundation (Deemed to be University), Salem, Tamil Nadu *vide* its letter No.VMRFDU/REG/VMMC&H/Karaikal/PG Renewal of Recog./2022/419 dated 11th May, 2022 requested the National Medical Commission to conduct assessment of the Vinayaka Mission's Medical College & Hospital, Karaikal for renewal of recognition of four (4) seats of MS (General Surgery) qualification in respect of students being trained at the medical college, having an annual intake capacity of four seats in the said course.

- 2. WHEREAS, the Post-Graduate Medical Education Board (PGMEB) got the assessment of Vinayaka Mission's Medical College & Hospital, Karaikal affiliated to Vinayaka Mission's Research Foundation (Deemed to be University), Salem, Tamil Nadu done on 16th December, 2022 for verification of infrastructure, clinical material, faculty for all-round training of students as per curriculum requirement. On scrutiny of the Assessment Report and other records, the Post-Graduate Medical Education Board (PGMEB) found the following deficiencies:
 - i. Inadequate bed occupancy;
 - ii. Inadequate OPD number
- 3. WHEREAS, the deficiencies stated in **para 2 above** were pointed out to the said medical college *vide* PGMEB Letter No.35/737(25)/2022-PGMEB/002160 dated 23rd January, 2023 and the medical college was given an opportunity to submit a written explanation in respect of the deficiencies. The said medical college furnished the reply vide letter No.VMMC&H, Karaikal/Medical/PG/NMC/2023/601 dated 20th February, 2023. The Compliance Verification Report, furnished by the said medical college, was placed before the Post-Graduate Medical Education Board. The medical college has not given proper justification for inadequate IPD and OPD clinical workload in the Department of General Surgery. Hence, the reply furnished by the medical college was found unsatisfactory and unacceptable by the Board.
- 4. WHEREAS, the responsibility of determination and maintenance of standards of post-graduate medical education is entrusted upon the Post-Graduate Medical Education Board of the National Medical Commission as per National Medical Commission Act, 2019 (NMC Act, 2019), Post-Graduate Medical Education Regulations-2000 (PGMER-2000) and Maintenance of Standards of Medical Education Regulations, 2023 (MSMER-2023). Further, Section 6.2 of the PGMER-2000 and Section 8(1) and (2) of the MSMER-2023, stipulate imposition of penalty(ies) on the medical college/institution, if they fail to comply with any statutory provisions.

5. WHEREAS the medical college has failed to comply with the requirements and has compromised with the quality of medical education. Considering the inadequate clinical workload in the IPD and OPD of General Surgery, which is adequate just for three post-graduate seats, the Post-Graduate Medical Education Board has decided to renew recognition of three seats of MS (General Surgery) and to reduce the annual intake capacity in the course of MS (General Surgery) from the existing four to three from the Academic Year 2024-2025. Hence, the break-up of MS (General Surgery) seats in the medical college will be as indicated below:

WHEREAS, the Post-Graduate Medical Education Board (PGMEB) got the assessment of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology of the Vinayaka Mission's Medical College & Hospital, Karaikal affiliated to Vinayaka Mission's Research Foundation (Deemed to be University), Salem, Tamil Nadu done on 16th December, 2022 for verification of infrastructure, clinical material, faculty for all-round training of students as per curriculum requirement. On scrutiny of the Assessment Report and other records, the Post-Graduate Medical Education Board (PGMEB) found the following deficiencies:

- Number of deliveries in the year 2022 were inadequate and were below the benchmark of 6 deliveries per day or 42 per week; and
- Inadequate OPD workload ii.
- WHEREAS, the deficiencies stated in para 1 above were pointed out to the said medical college vide PGMEB Letter No.35/737(24)/2022-PGMEB/010305 dated 6th March, 2023 and the medical college was given an opportunity to submit a written explanation in respect of the deficiencies. The said medical college furnished the reply vide letter No.VMMC&H, Karaikal/NMC/PG/Compliance/2023/1100 dated 3rd April, The Compliance Verification Report, furnished by the said medical college, was placed before the Post-Graduate Medical Education Board. The justification given by the medical college for low clinical workload in the Department has not been found accepted by the Board. Further, the deliveries and major surgeries are inadequate and are not as per norms. Hence, the reply furnished by the medical college has not been found satisfactory by the Board.

Vinayaka Mission's Research Foundation, Salem, *vide* its letter No.VMRFDU/REG/AVMC&H/PONDY/PG Recog./2022/418 dated 11th May, 2022 requested for conduct of inspection of Vinayaka Mission's Medical College and Hospital, Karaikal for recognition of **four seats of MD (Radio-diagnosis)** qualification in respect of students being trained at the medical college, having an annual intake capacity of four seats in the said course.

WHEREAS, the Post-Graduate Medical Education Board (PGMEB) got the assessment of Vinayaka Mission's Medical College and Hospital, Karaikal done on 16th December, 2022 for verification of infrastructure, clinical material, faculty for all-round training of students as per curriculum requirement. On scrutiny of the Assessment Report and other records, the Post-Graduate Medical Education Board (PGMEB) found the following deficiencies:

- Deficiency of one Professor; one Associate Professor; one Assistant Professor and two Senior Residents; and
- ii. Inadequate IP and OP workload in the Department as well as in the entire hospital.
