

International Boards & College Eligibility Qualification (Undergraduate)

Candidates who have completed their qualification from foreign universities or Boards of Higher Education recognized as equivalent to the +2 level in India by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU), New Delhi are eligible for undergraduate admission. If required, candidates must obtain an 'Equivalency Certificate' from AIU, New Delhi.

Admissions are conducted in accordance with the guidelines of the Association of Indian Universities and Statutory Bodies in India, such as National Medical Commission, Dental Council of India, National Commission for Homoeopathy, Pharmacy Council of India, Indian Nursing Council, All India Council for Technical Education, Rehabilitation Council of India and Bar Council of India. etc.

The following foreign qualifications are recognized as equivalent to the +2 level of an Indian Boards:

GCE 'A' Levels, International Baccalaureate (IB), STPM, Ontario Secondary School Diploma, South Australian Matriculation, 12 years General Secondary Education Certificate issued by the Ministry of Education, Higher Secondary Examinations of approved Boards, Senior Secondary qualifications, Sri Lankan 'A' Levels, Secondary Stage qualifications from National Examination Boards/Councils, 12 years Secondary Examination conducted by provinces of Australia and Canada, American High School Diploma, etc.

Asia:

Afghanistan	Candidates must have completed 12 years of education and obtained the Baccalaureate Certificate
Bangladesh	Candidates must have passed the Intermediate/ Senior Secondary/ Higher Secondary examination from approved Boards
Hong Kong	Candidates must have passed the GCE/ IGCSE/ GCSE examinations conducted by approved British Examining Bodies in Hong Kong with at least 5 subjects at the 'Ordinary Level' and 2 subjects at the 'Advanced Level'. For admission to professional courses such as medical/ engineering, candidates must have Advanced Level passes in Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Mathematics along with English, in addition to 5 passes at the GCE 'Ordinary Level'
Indonesia	Candidates must have completed 12 years of secondary education.
Japan	Candidates must have completed 12 years of secondary education.
Korea	Candidates must have completed 12 years of secondary education.

Malaysia	Candidates must have completed 12 years of education and passed the STPM examination.
Nepal	Candidates must have passed the Intermediate, Senior Secondary, or Higher Secondary examination from approved boards.
Singapore	Candidates must have passed the GCE, IGCSE, or GCSE examinations conducted by approved British examining bodies in Singapore, with at least five subjects at the Ordinary Level and two subjects at the Advanced Level. For admission to professional courses such as medical and engineering, candidates must have Advanced Level passes in Physics, Chemistry, and Biology or Mathematics, along with English, in addition to five passes at the GCE Ordinary Level.
Sri Lanka	Candidates must have passed the GCE Ordinary and Advanced Level examinations conducted by the Department of Examinations, Government of Sri Lanka.

EUROPE:

France	Candidates must have completed 12 years of education and obtained the Baccalaureate Certificate.
Germany	Candidates must have passed the Abitur examination
United Kingdom	Candidates must have passed the GCE, IGCSE, or GCSE examinations conducted by approved British examining bodies in the UK, with at least five subjects at the Ordinary Level and two subjects at the Advanced Level. For admission to professional courses such as medical and engineering, candidates must have Advanced Level passes in Physics, Chemistry, and Biology or Mathematics, along with English, in addition to five passes at the GCE Ordinary Level.

Middle East:

Bahrain	Candidates must have completed 12 years of education and obtained the General Secondary Education Certificate issued by the Ministry of Education.
Iran	Candidates must have completed 12 years of education and obtained the General Secondary Education Certificate issued by the Ministry of Education.
Iraq	Candidates must have completed 12 years of education and obtained the Baccalaureate Certificate.

Jordan	Candidates must have completed 12 years of education and obtained the General Secondary Education Certificate issued by the Ministry of Education.
Kuwait	Candidates must have completed 12 years of education and obtained the General Secondary Education Certificate issued by the Ministry of Education.
Oman	Candidates must have completed 12 years of education and obtained the General Secondary Education Certificate issued by the Ministry of Education.
Other Gulf Countries	Candidates must have completed 12 years of education and obtained the General Secondary Education Certificate issued by the Ministry of Education.
Saudi Arabia	Candidates must have completed 12 years of education and obtained the General Secondary Education Certificate issued by the Ministry of Education.
United Arab Emirates	Candidates must have completed 12 years of education and obtained the General Secondary Education Certificate issued by the Ministry of Education.
Yemen Arab Republic	Candidates must have completed 12 years of secondary education.

AFRICA:

Ethiopia	Candidates must have completed 12 years of secondary education and obtained a qualification from the National Examination Board or Council of the Ministry of Education.
Egypt	Candidates must have completed 12 years of education and obtained the General Secondary Education Certificate issued by the Ministry of Education.
Kenya	Candidates must have completed two years of secondary stage qualification from the National Examination Board or Council of the Ministry of Education.
Mauritius	Candidates must have passed the GCE, IGCSE, or GCSE examinations conducted by approved British examining bodies in Mauritius, with at least five subjects at the Ordinary Level and two subjects at the Advanced Level. For admission to professional courses such as medical and engineering, candidates must have Advanced Level passes in Physics, Chemistry, and Biology or Mathematics, along with English, in addition to five passes at the GCE Ordinary Level.

Nigeria	Candidates must have completed two years of secondary stage qualification from the National Examination Board or Council of the Ministry of Education.
Sudan	Candidates must have completed two years of secondary stage qualification from the National Examination Board or Council of the Ministry of Education.
Tanzania	Candidates must have completed two years of secondary stage qualification from the National Examination Board or Council of the Ministry of Education.
Tunisia	Candidates must have completed 12 years of education and obtained the Baccalaureate Certificate.
Uganda	Candidates must have completed two years of secondary stage qualification from the National Examination Board or Council of the Ministry of Education.

United State of America

United State of America	Candidates must have completed 12 years of education and obtained a High School Diploma awarded by an accredited American school or by international schools following the American pattern of education.

Australia	Candidates must have completed 12 years of secondary education and passed the Secondary Stage Examination conducted by various provinces in Australia.

Canada	Candidates must have completed 12 years of secondary education and passed the Secondary Stage Examination conducted by various provinces in Canada.

Age limit

The Candidate should have completed the age of 17 years on or before 31st December of the year of admission.

Candidates with Foreign qualifications must submit an equivalency certificate from the University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi, in accordance with the requirements of their chosen programme.
